The pieces considered here are all modest in scale, all date from the decade of the seventies, and are fully characteristic. All are original paintings.

Lake Trout With Eggs from 1973 recalls the artist's early monochromatic approaches. The Untitled work from 1979 includes a shaman figure among representative fish, bear, birds and reptile. The Untitled (Animal Spirits Facing Inward) 1970 is an important distillation, pointing to chthonic origins, and the Untitled (Fish with Minnows) is thought to have been an endearing gift for a child. Together these examples expand the repertoire of material that the Thunder Bay art Gallery can offer for research on this highly important national treasure.

I have collected native art all my life, as my father was a collector who planted the seed. I first became aware of Norval Morrisseau around the early 80's, when I was introduced to him at a home of a friend in Thunder Bay, Ontario. He was staying with him and used a large room in the house to paint in. This is where I had a chance to see him at work for the first time. It was shortly after this that he went to Kenora to sell some of his works to a large fishing resort on Lake of the Woods and wound up in jail. After that episode I began to collect his paintings.

A lot of my friends and work associates lived on and worked in or around native reserves, so this gave me access to large volumes of artwork at little expense. These pieces were mostly lesser known artists, but the odd piece would show up by by <u>Carl Ray</u>, <u>Roy Thomas</u>, Lloyd Kakepetum, and even Morrisseau. This was always a nice surprise as I would pay the same for each piece no matter who was the artist. I found myself with hundreds of paintings by such a large array of artists that I decided to begin to trade them with other collectors. I used to joke that it reminded me of trading baseball cards when I was younger.

On that blog Mr. Sinclair has been videotaped by along time employee (since 1989) of Kinsman Robinson John MacGregor Newman (Associate Director) labeled <u>"Questionable</u> Works" and <u>"Apprenticeship Vs Fraud Revisited"</u> as per <u>Exhibit</u> #2 and <u>Exhibit #3</u>. Moreover, the Kinsman Robinson Gallery provided a direct link from their web site to Mr. Sinclair web site www.morrisseau.com where Mr. Sinclair's wild claims of posting over 1,000 fake images of the artist Norval Morrisseau can be seen. It is done In <u>Exhibit #3</u> at the end of the article were the link is titled "More". Once the user clicks on the icon the reader is taken directly to www.morrisseau.com as per <u>Exhibit #4</u> Mr. Sinclair's web site <u>www.morrisseau.com</u> as per <u>Exhibit #4</u> Mr. Sinclair clearly highlights and shows the video's of his conservation's which were done at the Kinsman Robinson gallery.

Mr. Sinclair as per Exhibit #5 and Exhibit #6 has identified these paintings as "fakes" etc. The one painting fake number # 256 as per **Exhibit #5** was in fact in my possession but was donated to the Thunder Bay Art Gallery by my family. Enclosed please find a copy of that submission as per **Exhibit #7**. This painting was vetted by the Thunder Bay Art Gallery, it's staff and then further vetted and approved by the Government of Canada as per the Cultural Property Review Board. Despite this, this painting has been identified and labeled a "fake" on Mr. Sinclair's web site www.morrisseau.com. This is relevant because the source of that painting is the same as "fake" number # 324 called "Jesuit Priest Bringing Word" as per Exhibit #6 (see image above). Mr. Sinclair calls it a "fake" without even knowing who owned the painting. I gave the image of this painting to Mr. Ugo Matulic who posted this image on his blog called norvalmorrisseau.blogspot.com. as per Exhibit #8. Mr. Sinclair copied that image from that web site and put it on his web site www.morrisseau.com and called it a "fake". Mr. Sinclair even calls it a "fake" from Ugo on his (Mr. Sinclair's web site) and even refers to Mr. Matulic's blog and refers to the paintings as a "fake" not knowing that I own it. As per Exhibit #9 enclose a copy of the sales receipt and a picture of the painting (both front and back) at my home.

The importance of that fact that this painting was purchased at Randy Potter Auctions which is the same source that Don Robinson of Kinsman Robinson bought from as per **Exhibit #10** which includes a statement from the auction house owner Mr. Randy Potter.

I personally met with Mr. Sinclair on February 12th, 2004 as per_ <u>Exhibit #11</u>. As it turns out Mr. Sinclair didn't pay his storage fees and it's contents were impounded by Centron Self Storage who just happened to consign it to Randy Potter Auctions. I was sitting close to Mr. Sinclair as I bid on several Norval Morrisseau paintings. Nobody wanted to purchase Mr. Sinclair's paintings which were impounded by Centron and Mr. Sinclair's friend bought back Mr. Sinclair's own art on the same night (Feb 12th, 2004).

Kinsman Robinson is and was fully aware that the paintings on <u>www.morrisseau.com</u> were either purchased from Potter Auctions or from the web sites of the galleries on their competitors which are named by Mr. Sinclair on the web site. Please refer now to **Exhibit #14** which is from a now defunct log named

<u>honouringnorvalmorrisseau.blogspot.com</u> where the same interview from Mr. Sinclair was highlighted on that blog. The owner of that blog which I will not name agreed to voluntarily shut down that blog in mid October 2008. The writer who went by the handle Raven admits such and was posted by Kinsman Robinson on Kinsman Robinson's own blog as per **Exhibit #15**:

"Faced with a potential lawsuit, I had a choice to make about continuing the blog. As I have no financial interest in the authentication issue either way, it is wise for me to exit given the new levels of nastiness this matter has reached. It appears that public statements made by Ritchie Sinclair at morrisseau.com and on the KRG blog have caused this matter to boil over. I wish you all well and thank you for your complementary emails. Hopefully this matter will be resolved soon because it is killing the native art movement."

Kinsman Robinson even enters the comments from Mr. Sinclair on their blog as per **Exhibit #16**. It is posted by stardreamer who is Mr. Sinclair. Mr. Sinclair starts off by thanking Kinsman Robinson for posting his interview and states:

" My eyes are now wide open and I see an over whelming evergrowing body of evidence that tells me that I absolutely must do what I can to stop this. What I see dangerous, dark pieces of art, that I for one would not hang above my bed and expect a good nights sleep."

What Mr. Sinclair is doing is posting images of Norval Morrisseau paintings which he admits he gathered (see below) from the Internet and is now calling them **"fakes".**

Thus, Kinsman Robinson knew of the problems in the marketplace created by Mr. Sinclair and still encouraged and facilitated Mr. Sinclair's wild claims of "fake" Norval Morrisseau's in the marketplace. Moreover, Kinsman Robinson proactively redirected people to Mr. Sinclair's web site. The link is from the Kinsman Robinson site to Mr. Sinclair's web site This was and is an action which could only have been initiated and implemented by Kinsman Robinson - it is their web site. Moreover, the link has to be established on Kinsman Robinson's network and through the various software programs on their computer systems. Moreover, the title, labeling, content and innuendo contained in these articles invite the reader to migrate to Mr. Sinclair's site. What else could reasonably be expected when a reader readers the banner' "Questionable Works" and "Fraud Vs Apprenticeship". It is clear that they are designed and intended to redirect the reader to Mr. Sinclair's web site and it's obvious misrepresentations. Mr. Sinclair claims over 1,000 paintings as "fakes" and what does he offer as evidence. Nothing. Kinsman Robinson are aware of the obvious market implications of Mr. Sinclair's misrepresentations and have given him a platform to spread these falsehoods.

§ 8 Although the majority of the provinces and the three territories have enacted defamation statutes, only that of Ontario changes the law with respect to injurious falsehood. It provides as follows [17]:

"In an action for slander of title, slander of goods or other malicious falsehood, it is not necessary to allege or prove special damage,

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THE LAW OF DEFAMATION-

Uniquely among the world's legal systems, English common law divides defamation into two categories: libel, which covers publication in a form with some permanence, such as books or newspapers, and slander, which deals with the more transitory publication by spoken word or gesture.

The distinction arises from an accident of history, the sixteenth-century competition for power and jurisdiction between the Ecclesiastical Courts and the Star Chamber. The Ecclesiastical Courts dealt with defamation, both written and oral as sin, imposing penance on the wrongdoer. The Star Chamber punished "libel", both written and oral, as a crime. By 1855, the civil Courts of King's Bench had inherited the jurisdiction of both the Star Chamber and the Ecclesiastical Courts. For the first time, one court had jurisdiction over all written and oral defamation. Rather than merging the two, however, the court of King's Bench separated written and oral publications into libel and slander, respectively.

The common law's rather artificial distinction between libel and slander does not readily lend itself to an easy classification of defamation published! by way of twentieth-century technology. For instance, are defamatory words spoken but broadcast by radio a slander or a libel? Similarly, how are words and images communicated by television to be categorized? Each province and territory, except Quebec, has enacted its own Libel and Slander Act, Defamation Act or territorial ordinance, incorporating the old common law with minor modifications to take account of such modem issues. Ontario's Libel and Slander Act, deems the broadcast of defamatory words, pictures, visual images, gestures and other methods of signifying meaning to constitute libel.

There is no all-encompassing definition of defamation. Gatley on Libel and Slander, says that "a defamatory imputation is one to a man's discredit or which tends to lower him in the estimation of others, or to expose him to hatred, contempt or ridicule, or to injure his reputation in his office, trade or profession or to injure his financial credit." Jeremy Williams in The Law of Defamation in Canada describes defamation more simply as "an invasion of the plaintiff's interest in his reputation and good name."

The reputation to be protected is not the one that the plaintiff believes he or she has, wishes he or she had or even deserves, but rather the one actually held of him or her by the community in general. Reputation is what others think of you, not what you think of yourself. For this reason, the defamatory words, to be actionable, must be communicated (published) to at least one other person. Such publication is an essential element that must be proven by the plaintiff, unless it occurs in the mass media, in which case the Libel and Slander Act deems publication to have occurred, without further proof. Defamation is virtually the only cause of action where it takes more than two to tango.

Defamation is a strict liability tort. The intention of the writer or publisher has no bearing on the outcome. If the words at issue are capable of bearing a defamatory imputation, liability will attach whether or not those words were intended innocently. Once published, particularly in the mass media, words and images take on a life of their own and their author can no longer control the meaning or meanings that may be attached to them by the recipient. Fault on the part of the defendant is not necessary to establish liability (except in Quebec), although fault, if found, will certainly exacerbate the damages that may be awarded. Defamation as a cause of action is personal to the person aggrieved and may only be maintained and prosecuted by that person. The cause of action dies with the ones I saw from the rock paintings and birch bark scrolls our people used to make."

ELEMENTS OF A LIBEL ACTION

The law of defamation seeks to balance two often-opposing societal interests: freedom of speech and of the press on the one hand and the importance of reputation on the other.

In an action for libel, the plaintiff is required to prove:

(a) that the libellous statement has been communicated to some person other than the person of whom it is written (when published through the mass media this is presumed);

(b) that the libel refers to him or her (or it, because a corporation too has a reputation to protect); and

(c) that the statement is defamatory, that is, that the plaintiffs reputation has been adversely affected.

In an action for slander, the plaintiff must in addition prove actual damages unless the slander imputed a crime to the plaintiff or the plaintiff has been defamed in the way of his or her office, calling or profession.

LEGAL PRESUMPTIONS (REVERSE ONUS)

Once the plaintiff has proven the three essential elements (four in the case of slander), the law presumes that:

(a) The statement is false;

(b) It was published with malice, that is, without an honest belief in its truth or recklessly as to its truth, or was published for some ulterior purpose; and

(c) The plaintiff has suffered damage.

These legal presumptions are often referred to as a reverse onus. Unlike virtually every other form of civil litigation, which requires the plaintiff to prove his or her case on a balance of probabilities and requires the defendant to do nothing until such occurs, the law of defamation deems the plaintiff to have proven his or her case once evidence of the three elements referred to above has been produced. Unless the defendant displaces the presumptions, the plaintiff will succeed. This shift in onus places a heavy burden on the defendant, often requiring that a negative be proven, something which may be difficult, if not impossible, to do.

There are essentially three types of defamatory statements:

(a) A statement that is defamatory on its face by a plain reading of the words at issue;

(b) A statement which contains a false innuendo, that is, carrying an inference that possibly may be seen as defamatory only by persons possessing the necessary contextual knowledge. The particular juxtaposition of words, phrases, sentences or even paragraphs may give rise to additional meanings never intended by the author but inferred from the particular construction of the piece at issue; and

(c) A legal or true innuendo which is not defamatory on its face but becomes defamatory when it is conjoined with facts or circumstances extrinsic to the article in question but known to at least some members of the audience. The innuendo may arise from the use of special language, technical terminology or slang, or terms of art, which, to people who

JUDGMENT

[1] This is one of several matters brought by Mr. Otavnik involving a serious issue of the authenticity of a Norval Morrisseau painting owned by the Plaintiff.

[2] The first issue in this Claim is whether the Defendant Cole can be found responsible for the content of a web site called <u>morrisseau.com</u>. I find he is not. I dismissed the Claim at trial with reasons to follow.

[3] The Defendant has the same residential and mailing address as a Mr. Ritchie Sinclair, who is known in certain Canadian contexts as "Stardreamer". (See, for example, action CU-08-00366828 which was recently dismissed as abandoned, and the pleadings in action SC-09 - 82782).

[4] Messrs Cole & Ritchie are partners in a business called "Friendship Enterprises" which originated an initiative in the 1990's called the "Heartfelt project". As can be seen from Exhibit 2, this project is referred to on the home page of "<u>Remembrances.ca</u>" in the "connect" link. This web page gives the Defendant's address as that for Friendship Enterprises together with an email for it: "connect @Remembrances.ca".

[5] Friendship Enterprises held a memorial for Mr. Morrisseau in December 2007 (Tab 5 of Exhibit 1)

[6] The <u>Remembrances.ca</u> site seems to have been accessed by Mr. Otavnik through <u>stardreamers.com</u>, the same site given in Exhibit 2 as to where there is more information about Mr. Sinclair. This <u>Remembrances.ca</u> site, Exhibit 2 states, was designed and programmed by "Stardreamer Netmedia", email "contacts@stardreamers.com'. No corporate or business search was filed for Stardreamer Netmedia or Stardreamer Media.

[7] The <u>stardreamers.com</u> site (Exhibit 6) has Mr. Sinclair as the sole focus.

[8] Exhibit 1 Tab 4 pages 2 & 3 are web pages from a site called <u>whois.domaintools.com</u> indicating Mr. Cole has registered 2 domains. <u>Netgenerationlawfirm.com</u> cannot be found on the web: it is a link to nowhere.

[9] The second website registered by the Defendant is <u>vibrationalarts.com</u>. The Defendant's email address on the <u>whois.domaintools.com</u> record is "contact@canada2.com". The site is copyrighted "1999-2008 Stardreamer Media". It has a single page with a logo of, & links to, Stardreamer. It has no content other than links to six 'dot-coms', including <u>morrisseau.com</u>. Three of the other 5 links are not available, while the other 2 relate solely to Mr. Ritchie (Stardreamer).

[10] Exhibit 4 is a copy of the home page of <u>www.morrisseau.com</u> as of April, 2009. It is clear this site is the sole purview of Stardreamer. There is no mention of, or links to, Mr. Cole.

[11] Next, Mr. Otavnik filed Exhibit 3 which is a page from <u>canada2.com/vision</u> showing that Messrs. Cole & Sinclair, as partners in Friendship Enterprises, are the "principle (sic) architects of the Canada 2 Project, which "is a network of web channels...... that will permanently serve Canadian communities" in the "medium of interactive television".

[12] Tab 3 of Exhibit 1 is the home page of <u>canada2.com</u> as of this month. It shows that the website was developed by Stardreamer Netmedia and copyrighted 1999-2003 by Friendship Enterprises.

[13] This same <u>whois.domaintools.com</u> site records the registrant of <u>canada2.com</u> as Stardreamer Netmedia, not Mr. Cole (Exhibit 5).

[14] Both Exhibit 1 Tab 4 Page 1 (a Google search page) and Exhibit 4 (the Morrisseau web site) contain a link to <u>MorrisseauBuyersBeware.com</u>, which is, again, a link to nowhere.

[15] The Plaintiff argued that because Messrs. Cole & Ritchie live at the same address and are partners in one business (Friendship Enterprises), the activities of Stardreamer (Mr. Sinclair) are also the activities of Mr. Cole. Mr. Otavnik argued "estoppel" and "partnership estoppel", but essentially was arguing without facts. The Plaintiff is wrong in law and on the meagre evidence adduced.

[16] Most obviously, the Friendship Enterprises 'partnership' has had nothing to do with art or with morrisseau.com. No corporate, business or internet search or documents were filed.

[17] A one page web site (vibrationalarts.com) registered by the Defendant has a hyperlink to the Morrisseau site administered by his Friendship Enterprise partner and roommate. This fact, either alone or in combination with the other facts recited above, does not remotely establish on a balance of probabilities that the Defendant has participated in the Morrisseau site.

[18] The decision of the B.C. Court of Appeal in <u>Crookes v Wikimedia Foundation Inc.</u> [2009] B.C.J. No. 1832 is clear: providing a hyperlink is not participation in, or promulgation of,^{*} that site's content.

[19] The Defendant has not directly or indirectly slandered Mr. Otavnik's title to his Morrisseau painting, defamed the Plaintiff or Mr. Morrisseau, or issued an injurious falsehood.

[20] The Claim is dismissed with costs of \$590.00 under Rules 19.01 (\$40), 19.03 (\$50), & 19.05 (\$500).

[1] Mr. Otavnik is charged with three counts of criminal harassment under section 264(1)(b) of the Criminal Code:

[2] The complainants work for CSI Global Education Inc. ("CSI"). This company offers courses in order to educate people who wish to work in a licensed capacity in the securities industry. The complainants are: (1) Dr. Roberta Wilton, Chief Executive Officer (CEO); (2) Mr. Mitchell Marcus, General Counsel; and (3) Mr. Steve Lowden, Vice President, Strategic Capabilities. Mr. Lowden's position involves overseeing the human resources function of the corporation.

Background and Facts

[3] By all accounts, Mr. Otavnik has had a long and difficult history with the company. He took a number of courses with CSI, but was unhappy with what he perceived to be his unfair treatment. He then applied for an employment position with the company and was unhappy when he was not hired. It was the latest contact – the contact in relation to his potential hiring – which led to the behaviour and resultant charges that are before the court.

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[4] The acts which form the subject matter of the charges are not in dispute. The primary dispute between the parties concerns, first, Mr. Otavnik's intent when committing the acts in question and, secondly, whether the complainants were fearful as a result of this conduct and, if fearful, whether this fear was objectively reasonable.

[5] On March 7, 2006, Mr. Otavnik sent an email to CSI expressing concern about its hiring practices as he noticed that the company was continually recruiting for the same job positions yet did not acknowledge its receipt of his application for these jobs nor his resume.

[6] We then move to April 20, 2006. At that time, the March 7th email was brought to Mr. Lowden's attention given a number of phone calls that Mr. Otavnik had apparently made to the company after he sent the March 7th email. Mr. Lowden then contacted Mr. Otavnik by email in an attempt to address his concerns. What followed was a series of emails that were sent over the days that followed, culminating in Mr. Otavnik's arrival at CSI on April 26, 2006. I will summarize the contents of Mr. Otavnik's emails to CSI.

[7] On April 24, 2006, Mr. Otavnik emailed Dr. Wilton, expressing dismay that he had not heard back again from Mr. Lowden. He attached a copy of his response to Mr. Lowden's April 20th email. In that response, he complained of CSI's exam practices which he claimed had disadvantaged him sometime in the past. He then stated, "I didn't litigate it. I am not in such a generous mood now". He then complained of CSI's current hiring policies, and went on to state "[p]lease tell Dr. Wilton that her PhD in 17th Century literature won't prepare hear (sic) for what I can do. And yes my lawyers are better than yours".

[8] At that point, a decision was made to involve Mr. Marcus. He wrote a response to Mr. Otavnik, acknowledging receipt of Mr. Otavnik's email to Dr. Wilton, and said that the matter had been referred to him for his review.

[9] Mr. Otavnik responded on April 24, 2006 at 3:17 pm, correcting Mr. Marcus' spelling, and stating "I hope you pay closer attention to information in any of your court filings' because I can assure you that I do. Please don't make me wait for Dr. Wilton's call. I can be reached at 1-905-728-2133. I look forward to hearing from Dr. Wilton".

[10] Mr. Marcus responded a few minutes later by telling Mr. Otavnik that all communications should be sent to him and that no one else in the company would be dealing with Mr. Otavnik. A few minutes after that email was sent, Mr. Otavnik emailed back to Mr. Marcus, stating in part "Don't be so stupid as to insult my intelligence by suggesting you have contacted Dr. Wilton as she has directed you to handle this case in this manner. Whereas you may be stupid enough to not understand where any action may go you (sic)

employer will not allow you to be as foolish. I have no intention of contacting you and you really don't want not to tell Dr. Wilton to call me. You are making decision(s) above your pay scale now Sir and I suggest you think long and hard about your next decision. Dr. Wilton has until 5:00 (sic) pm tomorrow to call me".

[11] At that point, Mr. Marcus emailed Mr. Otavnik, telling him that "your communications are rude, harassing and your threats are intended to serve no purpose other than to intimidate". He told him that all further communication should be done through legal counsel and that he must stop communicating directly with any of the complainants.

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[12] Mr. Otavnik then replied that he was acting as counsel, and that "I will contact who I want when I want. If you want me to stop I suggest you get an injunction (sic)-you do know what that is right?...I did not contact you. As a litigant I have the option to sue and serve when I want and who I want. Perhaps I should wait for Dr. Wilton to give a speech before the Toronto Board of Trade etc and serve her personally in front of a crowd. If you don't think I have the stones to do it you really don't know me....Have a nice day".

[13] The next day, Mr. Otavnik contacted Dr. Wilton directly by email, stating that he looked forward to hearing from her that day. He then followed up in the late afternoon with an email to Mr. Marcus, stating that he would be at CSI the next day in order to deliver "one final notice before I contact ONCAP and Onex Corporation". My understanding is that ONCAP invests in CSI and that it is part of the Onex Corporation.

[14] Mr. Otavnik did arrive at CSI the next day and was stopped by security. He had a letter directed to Dr. Wilton that said in part "if I do not hear from you soon I will be contacting you in a manner and form which you may not appreciate".

The Elements of Criminal Harassment

[15] What the Crown is required to prove under section 264 is outlined in the Alberta Court of Appeal decision <u>R. v. Sillipp</u> (1997), 11 C.R. (5th) 71, adopted by the Ontario Court of Appeal in <u>R. v. Kosikar</u>, [1999] O.J. No. 3569:

18 In the result, a proper charge to a jury in a criminal harassment case must include reference to the following ingredients of the crime, all of which must be proved beyond a reasonable doubt:

1) It must be established that the accused has engaged in the conduct set out in s. 264(2) (a), (b), (c), or (d) of the Criminal Code.

2) It must be established that the complainant was harassed.

3) It must be established that the accused who engaged in such conduct knew that the complainant was harassed or was reckless or wilfully blind as to whether the complainant was harassed;

4) It must be established that the conduct caused the complainant to fear for her safety or the safety of anyone known to her; and

5) It must be established that the complainant's fear was, in all of the circumstances, reasonable.

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[16] Further, though the Crown must prove that the accused knew or was reckless or was wilfully blind to the fact that the complainant was harassed, the Crown does not need to establish that the accused knew or was reckless or was wilfully blind to the fact that his conduct caused the complainant to fear for his safety – the Crown must simply prove beyond a reasonable doubt that such fear existed, regardless of whether the accused intended by his actions to cause such fear - see <u>R. v. Sillipp</u>, supra, and <u>R. v. Krushel</u>, [2000] O.J. No. 302 (Ont. C.A.).

Charge involving Mr. Lowden

[17] I find that the Crown has established beyond a reasonable doubt that Mr. Otavnik is guilty of the charges involving Dr. Wilton and Mr. Marcus. I find, however, that the elements of the offence have not been proven in relation to Mr. Lowden. Specifically, I find that the Crown has not proven that the communication with Mr. Lowden was repeated.

[18] It is clear that the primary focus of the emails is the CEO of CSI, namely, Dr. Wilton. The Crown contends that though the emails are directed at various individuals, Mr. Otavnik's intent was that all of the communications were to be conveyed to all three complainants.

[19] The particular subsection under which Mr. Otavnik has been charged requires repeated communication. While repeated communication is not required for certain subsections of criminal harassment, such as section 264(2)(d), it is required for the subsection under which Mr. Otavnik has been charged.

[20] I do not agree with the Crown's submission that the generalized communication of March, 2006 was directed towards Mr. Lowden. Though the complaints dealt with hiring policies, which clearly could fall under the rubric of "human resources" that Mr. Lowden headed, I find the communication was of too general a nature to conclude that it was directed at Mr. Lowden.

[21] Further, other than the one communication directed at Mr. Lowden specifically, I find that it cannot be inferred that Mr. Otavnik was trying to communicate with Mr. Lowden indirectly through his subsequent emails. In my view, it is clear that the primary intended recipient of all of the emails was Dr. Wilton, whether or not they were addressed to her specifically. I reach this conclusion after examining the totality of the emails, his expressed repeated intention to contact Dr. Wilton, and his intent as expressed in email to serve Dr. Wilton publicly and further to attend at the CSI offices personally.

[22] Given my finding that the "repeated" requirement in relation to Mr. Lowden has not been established, it is unnecessary for me to deal with the other elements of the offence involving Mr. Lowden. The count relating to Mr. Lowden is therefore dismissed.

(a) Intention to Harass

[23] It is conceded by the defense that Mr. Otavnik's communications with both Mr. Marcus and Dr. Wilton were repeated and that both were harassed by that conduct.

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[24] In <u>Kosikar</u>, supra, the state of being harassed is defined as being "tormented, troubled, worried continually or chronically, plagued, bedevilled and badgered" (para. 25). I agree and find as a fact that Mr. Otavnik engaged in harassing conduct in relation to Mr. Marcus and Dr. Wilton.

[25] Though the defense concedes that Mr. Marcus and Dr. Wilton were harassed, it is not conceded that Mr. Otavnik knew, or was reckless or was wilfully blind to this harassment.

[26] The Supreme Court of Canada, in <u>R. v. Sansregret</u>, [1985] S.C.J. No. 23, compared and contrasted the civil concept of negligence and the higher standard required for the criminal concept of recklessness. Negligence carries with it the objective standard of the reasonable man. Recklessness must carry with it the additional requirement of subjectivity:

It is found in the attitude of one who, aware that there is danger that his conduct could bring about the result prohibited by the criminal law, nevertheless persists, despite the risk. It is, in other words, the conduct of one who sees the risk and who takes the chance. It is in this sense that the term "recklessness" is used in the criminal law and it is clearly distinct from the concept of civil negligence (para 16).

[27] The Court then differentiates between recklessness and wilful blindness:

Wilful blindness is distinct from recklessness because, while recklessness involves knowledge of a danger or risk and persistence in a course of conduct which creates a risk that the prohibited result will occur, wilful blindness arises where a person who has become aware of the need for some inquiry declines to make the inquiry because he does not wish to know the truth. He would prefer to remain ignorant. The culpability in recklessness is justified by consciousness of the risk and by proceeding in the face of it, while in wilful blindness it is justified by the accused's fault in deliberately failing to inquire when he knows there is reason for inquiry. (para. 22).

[28] Justice Doherty described wilful blindness as "deliberate ignorance" – see <u>R. v.</u> <u>Lagace</u> (2003), 181 C.C.C. (3d) 12 (Ont. CA) at para. 28. Further, in <u>R. v. Malfara</u>, [2006] O.J. No. 2069, the Ontario Court of Appeal noted that the question was whether the accused was in fact suspicious as opposed to whether he should have been suspicious (para. 2).

[29] Mr. Berg argues that Mr. Otavnik's stated intention was simply to commence civil litigation and thus he did not intend to harass. To further substantiate this argument, it is noted that CSI is the exclusive provider of the courses that must be taken before one can

work in a licensed capacity in the securities industry. Mr. Otavnik thus had no option but to deal with CSI.

[30] I find that Mr. Otavnik did intend to harass both Mr. Marcus and Dr. Wilton. I also agree that Mr. Otavnik thought that he would pursue civil litigation if matters could not be otherwise resolved in his favour. The fact that Mr. Otavnik wished to seek redress for the alleged wrongs he had suffered and to obtain that redress through civil litigation proceedings is not dispositive of the issue of whether he intended to harass.

[31] Further, intent and motive must not be confused; they are separate concepts. The distinction has been emphasized in many judgments, most recently in <u>R. v. Cromwell</u>, [2008] N.S.J. No. 283 (N.S.C.A). In the <u>Cromwell</u> case, the defense argued that the mens rea component had not been proven because Mr. Cromwell had communicated with the complainant in an attempt to reconcile. In rejecting this argument, the Court stated:

With respect that is not the law. The mens rea on a charge of criminal harassment contrary to s. 264 of the Criminal Code is whether the accused knew, or was reckless, or wilfully blind as to whether the complainant was harassed. The mental element is the intention to engage in the prohibited conduct with knowledge, or with recklessness, or with willful blindness that such conduct causes the victim to be harassed. Thus, the mens rea of the offence is the intention to engage in the prohibited conduct with the knowledge that the complainant is thereby harassed. R: v: Sillipp, supra; and R. v: Krushel (2000), 31 C.R. (5th) 295, 142 C.C.C. (3d) 1 (Ont. C.A.).

40 The appellant appears to be confounding intent with motive. In the criminal law the two terms are distinct. An innocent motive to reconcile is not dispositive of the required mens rea on a charge of criminal harassment. It is well established in the criminal law that the mental element of a crime ordinarily involves no reference to motive. For example, while motive, or the absence of motive, may be compelling evidence to prove identity, it is legally irrelevant to criminal responsibility. See, for example, R. v. Lewis, [1979] 2 S.C.R. 821 at para. 27, 35; R. v. Chartrand, [1994] 2 S.C.R. 864, para. 57-58. (at paras. 39-40)

[32] Mr. Otavnik stated on April 24 at 10:57 a.m. that he didn't litigate when he was previously wronged by C.S.I. but he was "not in such a generous mood now". Further, in the same email, he made the comment that Mr. Marcus should "tell Dr. Wilton that her PhD in 17th Century literature won't prepare hear (sic) for what I can do. And yes my lawyers are better than yours". Approximately four hours later, he told Mr. Marcus not to "make me wait for Dr. Wilton's call". Then, forty minutes later, "I have no intention of contacting you and you really don't want not to tell Dr. Wilton to call me".

[33] After Mr. Marcus tells him that he is being harassing and intimidating, he continues along the same vein. He tells Mr. Marcus, at 4:31 pm, that "I will contact who I want when I want", and that an injunction must be obtained to stop him. He also states "[p]erhaps I should wait for Dr. Wilton to give a speech before the Toronto Board of Trade etc and serve her personally in front of a crowd. If you don't think I have the stones to do it, you really don't know me". Finally, of course, he says that he will be delivering a final notice to the company in person the next day and, in fact, he does show up at CSI the following day.
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The very tone and wording of these emails make it clear that Mr. Otavnik intended to torment, trouble, plague, bedevil and badger both Mr. Marcus and Dr. Wilton in order to convince them to meet his demands in advance of formally commencing civil proceedings. Mr. Berg argues that this is just Mr. Otavnik's style of communication. I agree from my observations of Mr. Otavnik in court and during the course of his testimony that his manner is abrupt and borders upon being both abrasive and arrogant. The fact that the correspondence in question is consistent with Mr. Otavnik's communication style does not leave me with a reasonable doubt, however, that Mr. Otavnik intended to harass Dr. Wilton Mr. Otavnik's ultimate motive of obtaining redress from CSI, and of obtaining it through civil proceedings, is not, as per Cromwell, dispositive of the issue of intent. I accept that this was his ultimate motive. Co-existing with that motive, however, was the intent to harass, as proven by the email communications and by Mr. Otavnik's personal attendance at

and Mr. Marcus.

CSI.

The fourth and fifth elements outlined in Sillipp, supra, are that the conduct must [36] cause the complainant to fear for his safety and that such fear was, in all of the circumstances, reasonable. There is, therefore, a subjective and objective element to this part of the offence.

It is important to note that the consequence of reasonable fear does not have to be [37] intended by the accused. The mens rea component does not attach to this aspect of the offence - see R. v. Sillip, supra, at paras. 30-33 and R. v. Krushel, [2000] O.J. No. 302 (Ont. C.A.) at paras. 7-11.

In R. v. Krushel, Justice Catzman quoted the Alberta Court of Queen's Bench [38] decision in R. v. Sillip (1995), 99 C.C.C. (3d) 394 wherein Justice Murray outlined the mens rea of the offence, and its effect, as follows:

> In my opinion, s. 264 does not suffer from vagueness. Certainly there are many facets of it that will have to be interpreted by the Court. I have no doubt that as time progresses it will be given a constant and settled meaning. I have no problem interpreting s. 264 so as to understand that certain conduct is subject to legal restrictions and the area of risk is set out namely, if you intentionally behave in certain ways knowing that by doing so you are harassing another person then if your conduct causes that person to reasonably fear for his or her safety you run the risk of being criminally sanctioned. I would think that anyone reading the section would receive that message loud and clear.

I find that I am satisfied beyond a reasonable doubt that both Mr. Marcus and Dr. [39] Wilton feared for their safety and that such fear was reasonable in the circumstances.

[40] Mr. Marcus testified that the tone of the emails was escalating and that he perceived them as both hostile and menacing (see September 5, 2008 at pp. 31-32, 39 and 41). His fear was stated most clearly at pp. 54-55 of September 5^{th} :

A: I was uncomfortable, you know in the sense that, you've got to understand there's my own personal discomfort as well as I'm a family man. And you know...

Mr. Berg: Sorry?

A. I'm a family man, and you've got to look, and I'm sure of – the members here in the court here can understand when you – when I suggest that when you look at your own personal safety, you are looking in a larger context and have a sense of that as well in terms of appreciating when these type of communications start and where they can go. So... 2009 ONCJ 501 (CanLII)

Ms. Faria: So were ...

A. ...yes, I was..

Q: ...you concerned about your...

A. ...concerned...

Q: personal safety?...

A....about what this could personally mean to me.

The Court: Sorry? About what that?

A. What these – where this could go and what it could personally mean and what type of impact it could have to me personally

[41] I accept Mr. Marcus' testimony on this point.

[42] I am aware that Mr. Marcus did not use the specific word "fear". I have also considered other aspects of his testimony, such as his testimony at pp. 62-64 on September 5, 2008 that he was feeling "uncertain" as a result of the communications. When I assess all of his evidence, however, I find that I am convinced beyond a reasonable doubt that he did fear for his safety.

[43] Further, I find that Dr. Wilton feared for her safety. Dr. Wilton testified that she felt that matters had become personal. She felt uncomfortable and extremely vulnerable. She felt that the risk might be physical. Further, she felt it necessary to bring in security to protect both her and the staff – see October 26, 2007 transcript at pp. 18-19, 25, 35, 43-44.

[44] I accept Dr. Wilton's testimony on this point and find that the totality of her comments relevant to this issue makes it clear that she was fearful for her safety.

[45] I have also considered the defense submission that the behaviour of both Mr. Marcus and Dr. Wilton on April 26th suggests that they were not fearful. Mr. Marcus spoke of going down to the underground during his lunch hour and bringing his lunch back up to the office. Dr. Wilton spoke of proceeding with a Board meeting despite observing a stranger (Mr. Otavnik) in the midst of those assembled. I do not find that such actions lead me to conclude that they lacked fear, and I find that upon considering their actions and their

comments about their feelings on this date I am convinced that they were fearful. I also note that extra precautions had been taken that day, namely, an increased security presence.

[46] I also find that their respective fears were objectively reasonable.

[47] It was submitted by the defense:

It seems, furthermore, that C.S.I. never really examined the litigation issue in the context of the communications from Mr. Otavnik (Testimony of Dr. Wilton, ibid. 73-75). Indeed, it is submitted that by ignoring the clear litigation context of the offending communications, the complainants were left misunderstanding the nature of the e-mails, etc. It is submitted that resulting fear cannot be characterized as 'reasonable' when it occurs through tunnel vision. (Written Submissions, para. 36)

[48] The references to litigation are clear in the correspondence. I acknowledge the defense submission that Mr. Marcus is not a litigator; however, it would be impossible for any counsel or, indeed, any individual to miss the references to litigation. Though the question may not have been put to the complainants directly, I find it impossible to conclude that either Dr. Wilton or Mr. Marcus missed these references. The fact remains that despite the references to litigation, the tenor of the emails was very emotional, hostile, and threatening. There is no question that they are of a far different quality than that found in communications that are simply speaking of court action.

[49] I will not reiterate the entirety of the email comments made by Mr. Otavnik which I have outlined above. In my view, however, the nature of these comments is self-explanatory and I find that a reasonable person at the receiving end of such communications would be fearful for his or her safety.

[50] I therefore find that the Crown has proven all of the elements of the offences in relation to both Dr. Wilton and Mr. Marcus and I therefore find Mr. Otavnik guilty of these two counts.

Addendum Re Directed Verdict Judgment

[51] There was a motion for a directed verdict in this case that I dismissed. Mr. Berg quite correctly pointed out that the year that I attributed to most of the emails was incorrect. I indicated that the emails that form the crux of this matter, namely, the April emails, were sent in 2007. As the charges indicate a date of 2006, clearly such charges cannot be based upon emails sent in 2007.

[52] The point requires clarification. I misstated the 2007 date, and meant 2006 instead of 2007. The substance of that judgment is not affected by this clarification as the reasoning that I put forth applies equally to the corrected dates.

A couple of comments/concerns: I'm not sure that the Fakes and forgeries section clearly reflects the other side of the story. I don't think any of the text here should be deleted, but maybe some mention should be made of the fact that some of the claims made in the section are disputed. (I'm not trying to be an apologist for 123thehabs at all - I've reverted his/her edits, too.) For example, from Collectors sue gallery over disputed painting: "Mr. Morrisseau himself, according to documents filed in Ontario Superior Court, is alleged to have declared the painting a fake in 2006 in an e-mail to Heffel, an art auction house that was trying to sell Grandfather Speaks on behalf of the painting's then owner, Joseph Otavnik, an Oshawa art collector. These documents say that Heffel then withdrew the painting from the auction. But is the painting really a fake?

Mr. Morrisseau's word back then, when he was seriously ill with Parkinson's disease, was not accepted as gospel by everyone. So maybe the painting is real, after all. It depends upon whom you want to believe." This article also indicates that there is a dispute: Ojibwa painter's sons at odds over maintaining his artistic legacy. That said, I think there is probably more evidence that the Norval Morrisseau Heritage Society is the authentic arbiter of the authenticity of the paintings. 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There are and have been many misrepresentations by people with respect to the works' of Norval Morrisseau, I direct the reader to Exhibit "A" which is an article in National Post of May 18th, 2001. In the second paragraph Mr. Don Robinson (of Kinsman Robinson) states that he was suspicious of the authenticity of 23 paintings, which were brought to him by another collector who purchased theng at Kahn Auctions. I enclose in Exhibit 'B' a statement from that collector. Mr. Robinson in the article only mentions that he bought some works' of Norval Morrisseau at Kahn Auetions himself. In fact, over the period between late 1999 and early 2000 Mr. Robinson actually purchased 28 painting from the same auction house (please see Exhibit "("), he openly encouraged other people to buy them and unsuccessfully bid on another 40 to 60 more paintings from the same auction. house. Please refer to Exhibits "D" and "E" which are the statements from the auction house owners. Mr. Robinson in fact tried to get the supplier to sell to him directly and bypass Kahn auctions. The statements of the auction house owners clearly show this. Mr Robinson also states in the article that Norval knows who are painting these "fakes" but to date he has never named them nor pursued legal action against them. The question is Why would Mr. Robinson and his legal team not pursue the people Norval says he know were painting these so called "fakes"? In fact, Mr. Robinson and Mr. Morrisseaumanagement team would be deficient in their fiduciary duties to Mr. Morrisseau by not pursuing these people which he says Norval said he knows are painting them. Moreose to date Mr. Robinson and Norval's handlers cannot point to one case where they have proved that someone made, sold, distributed or even marketed one "fake". Not one case

Please now refer to Exhibit "1" which is the May 19th, 2001 letter from Don Robinson his clients, It is interesting that in this letter Mr. Robinson does not mention the name Kahn Auctions. Nor does he mention the fact that he bought and sold paintings from Kahn auctions in his gallery but contends that the collector who brought the paintings which were purchased from the same auction house (and same source) were fakes

Kinsman Robinson claim to be experts with respect to the authenticity of Norval Morrisseau paintings. I have an appraisal done by Kinsman Robinson from a clie clearly states where the painting was purchased (Kahn Auctions) and the subsequent appraisal as of August 18th, 1999. I have another appraisal done on October 30th of painting also purchased at Kahn auctions as per Exhibit "G " In both cases the Kather Robinson gallery provided appraisals. I have redacted the names of these people for but I can will reveal them if required. It is funny that the same auction house were WRobinson purchased his Morrisseau's says are now fakes were appraised and outhenticated by his own gallery as being authentic.

I now refer the relate to I within 'II. Here is the correspondence from 'Mr. Robinson's own lawyer stating the Mr. Robinson did in fact purchase the painting is i that he never bothered to tole the newspaper nor his own clients as per point 5 as per page 2. Moreover, it was Mr. Robinson who was victimized and "taken in". Some expert, Mr. Robinson contends they are takes but he has interestingly never asked for his money back. As he is the continuing investigation it's been seven (7) years and still no mention of anything I guess experts take their time.

Likeep reading in the various national publications (National Post, Toronto Star, The Globe and Mail, even the Toronto Sun) etc about the existence of all these so called takes. However, I have yet to hear of anyone, anywhere or at any time being convicted or even charged with selling/distributing etc of such Norval Morrisseau fakes. Moreover, and the opening of the Morrisseau show at the McMicheal Gallery Gade Vadas proclamed that he had a disk of 1200 Morrisseau paintings, 800 of which according to Gabe were fakes. I also enclose as per Exhibit "I" a copy some correspondence with Mr. Vadas's lawyer in Vancouver where his lawyer admits to the existence of this disk.

This now brings me to the Norval Morrisseau Heritage Society (NMHS). Mr. Morrisseau's children want and have nothing to do with this Committee. In fact it is merpreference that this Committee be disbanded. This Committee is supposed to work at arm's length and be independent yet they do not even have their own web site. Moreover the only way to contact the Committee is via a post office box in Ottawa that is intentioned on Kingsman Robinson web site. So much are independence and important Mr. Robinson has set up the Committee as his straw man. He then went to ADAC and had them implement a policy they prevented another members of the association to have the ability to authenticate a Morrisseau but then have other members of ADAC refer the NMHS to provide the authentication.

With respect to Mr. Morrisseaus' estate, Norval's family was left with nothing the set of the purposes of the Norval Morrisseau Legal Defence Fund is to raise funds in order help Norvals' children at Jeast benefit from any future dispositions of his works incluall intellectual rights.

To conclude, I ask the reader to forward a copy of this site to any other collector and a link to your local paper. I will keep people informed as to where and how payments the Norval Morrisseau I egal Defence Fund can be made.
